The Dean will provide leadership for preaching, regular worship, and innovating other Christian and interfaith initiatives and support the college's work of preparing students to live in a religiously diverse and challenging world. The function of this position requires a specific sense of calling to work with emerging adults and the staff and faculty who seek to serve students.

 - Empower and equip students, faculty, and staff to work together to provide innovative ministries on campus
 - Lead Worship Services
 - o Preach
 - o Provide Pastoral Counseling
- Provide the Spiritual Voice for the college
 - Work with the campus community to interpret and voice the theological foundations of Wartburg College's mission and identity as a college of the church, in past, current, and future contexts. In particular, with regards to:
 - The Heritage: Martin Luther, Löhe legacy of service to a changing world, College of the ELCA
 - The Mission Pillars: Leadership, Service, Faith, Learning
 - The call to challenge and nurture students for their future lives:
 Cultural Competence, Interfaith Activities, Vocation
 - Serve as administrative lead for the Spiritual Life & Campus Ministry (SLCM)
 Team
 - Utilize the Moehlmann Chaplaincy Chair and funds to engage the campus in opportunities for theological education and growth.

Academic duties

- As Moehlmann Chaplaincy Chair, serve as administrative faculty and relate to the academic program in ways appropriate to expertise and vocation
- Teach up to one course in each academic term in assignments appropriate to expertise and helpful to the full academic program.
