- 1) Provide short-term individual and crisis intervention counseling for the undergraduate student population. (98%)
- 2) Provide referral sources for students needing long-term counseling and/or psychiatric evaluation and hospitalization. (2%)
- 3) Perform other related duties as assigned.

Supervision:

Employee is responsible for determining own work assignments referring to policies and general objectives for guidance. Employee independently devises new methods to meet conditions and confers with supervisor regarding unusual matters.

Master's degree in counseling or closely related field; license-eligible in the State of Iowa; clinical experience in treating mood and anxiety disorders within the college student population, as well as facilitating support groups in this setting. Prefer assessment/diagnostic experience; knowledge of psychotropic medication and brief models of psychotherapy; experience with substance abuse education, stress management, eating disorders, and sexual misconduct issues.

Requires Master's degree in Counseling or a related field plus 3 to 4 years of effective experience. Must be license-eligible in the state of Iowa.
