Preference will be given to candidates with college-level teaching experience.

RESPONSIBILITIES: Teach (the equivalent of) three 14-week undergraduate courses in both fall and winter terms, as well as one 4-week May term course, including Philosophy (introduction; ancient and medieval), Peace & Justice studies, or ethics (philosophical and/or Christian). Preference will be given to candidates with demonstrable ability in two or more of the above. Mentor undergraduate research; advise student majors and minors; engage in scholarship and service appropriate to the liberal arts setting.

SALARY: Competitive.

CONTRACT: Nine-month, term contract; renewable up to three years based on an annual performance review and continuing institutional need.
