

### Notice of Faculty Position

- POSITION:** **Tenure-track Position in Education**  
(Rank dependent on qualifications and experience.)
- POSTING DATE:** Screening of the applications begins immediately and will continue until the position is filled.

- QUALIFICATIONS:** **Required:** Doctorate of Education (or ABD); at least three years of 5-12 successful teaching experience; college-level teaching experience; experience teaching introduction to education; commitment to student-centered learning, teacher preparation, and excellence in teaching; willingness to support the mission, <http://www.wartburg.edu/about/>, of the College and its liberal arts tradition.
- Preferred:** Ability to teach in the secondary education core and courses in content areas; knowledge of and experience with teacher education accreditation standards, secondary methods. Experience with assessment processes; experience with student teaching supervision; and successful experience working with diverse populations and settings.
- RESPONSIBILITIES:** Teach the equivalent of seven undergraduate courses (typically 3 in Fall term, 3 in Winter term, and 1 in May term) including courses in the professional core and other education offerings or general education courses dependent upon departmental needs and candidate's qualifications; 40 hours per five years of co-teaching in PK-12; advising, scholarship, and service duties as appropriate for the candidate's appointment.
- DEPARTMENT:** The Wartburg College Teacher Education Program is approved by the Iowa Department of Education and is accredited by CAEP; reaccreditation is scheduled for Spring 2022. With four full-time Education Department members, the program graduates 60-80 students each year. Students are licensed to teach in both elementary and secondary schools.
- SALARY:** Competitive for rank at appointment
- CONTRACT:** Nine-month, tenure-track (potential for summer contracts to carry out special duties or assignments).
