REGISTERING FOR STUDY ABROAD

To be full-time, students must be enrolled in a minimum of three-and-one half (3.5) equivalent course credits per semester, which is 13 semester hours (or thirteen classroom contact hours per week). To earn credit at the rate of nine course credits per year, which is typical at Wartburg, students must enroll in the equivalent of four-and-one half (4.5) course credits per semester abroad, which is equivalent to 16 semester hours per semester.

If students expect certain courses taken abroad to fulfill specific major, minor, or essential education requirements at Wartburg, the content must be equivalent, and the course must also be worth at least four semester hours to be equivalent to one course credit at Wartburg.

The course choices made by you and your advisee will be reviewed and approved by Wartburg Registrar Sheree Covert before the student is allowed to depart for study abroad program.

While students will receive letter grades from their semester abroad, grades earned in course work offered through other institutions will not be factored into their Wartburg grade point average.

Registration:

In March, students should complete the onsite registration form for VE 999 Venture Ed and include the country where they will be studying, i.e., VE 999 Venture Ed: Thailand. Students must also complete the Request to Earn Credit at Another Institution form and submit to the Registrar's Office. These forms may be obtained through the Forms link on My.Wartburg or in the Registrar's office.

How students can apply:

Students need to submit an application to the Wartburg Study Abroad program by Feb. 1 of the year proceeding the year they plan to study off campus.

COST AND ACCEPTANCE

For many programs, the cost is comparable to remaining on campus for a semester. Each applicant will receive a cost estimate sheet to consider helping them determine if study abroad is right for them.

The Wartburg Study Abroad program conducts an interview with each applicant. Once selected, applicants are required to attend mandatory orientation sessions. The Study Abroad program continues to be in contact with the student while they are gone, and conducts a reentry debriefing once they return to campus. In addition, each student completes an evaluation regarding their program with Study Abroad 101.

BEFORE DEPARTURE

Each student will be required to submit the following:

- -Health form
- -Participation form
- -Signatures from Advisor(s), Registrar, Financial Aid, Residential Life, and a "cultural advisor" (either a professor, international student, or returned study abroad student who had been immersed in their site abroad.)
