## Student Organization Officer Descriptions

Each organization shall have a president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. These four individuals work together to make organizations be successful. It is important for each officer to understand their role.

| Officer | Role in the Organization |
| :--- | :--- |
| President | - Leads the organizational meetings <br> - Meets with faculty/staff advisor often <br> - Appoints jobs to other officers <br> - Aware of what is going on around campus in other organizations |
| Vice President | - Assists the president <br> - If the president cannot perform any duties for some reason, the <br> vice president performs the president's position |
| Secretary | - Keeps all records for the organization <br> - During meetings take minutes and distributes them after the <br> meeting <br> - Files all documents for the organization <br> - Summarizes all events or activities the organization takes part in |
| - In charge of the organizations funds (60/agency/campus account) <br> - Handles money at all events/activities <br> - Gives the treasurer's report at each meeting <br> - Not required to hold funds <br> - Assists faculty/staff advisor in keeping track of funds |  |

## To Be a Successful Executive, you should:

- Know the purpose of the organization and the mission of the organization
- Inform the organization members of the purpose and mission
- Involve the organization members in each activity
- Know each member of the organization by name
- Help the members with problem areas
- Allow member to share weekly progress reports
- Accept and support decisions of the committee
- Delegate responsibility according to the interests of the individual organization members
- Write an evaluation of the organization's work at the conclusion of an event/activity
- Remember that he/she is responsible for the organization's programs
- NOT force his/her ideas on the organization
- Set a consistent meeting place and time
