

## How to Apply

- Completion of Wartburg West application for sophomore program
- 3.0 GPA overall
- Two letters of recommendation from faculty
- Interview and approval by the Wartburg West Committee

\*The WW Committee will also check with Student Life to ensure there are no significant violations of conduct on record.

## Program Cost

Students pay the same tuition as on-campus students. Your housing cost, which you pay to Wartburg, is comparable to on-campus housing.

Food costs may range from \$750 to \$1,500, depending on your personal eating tastes and habits. You can cook all your meals in your apartment if you choose, and you can share costs and cooking responsibilities with your roommates.

You are responsible for arranging and paying for your own transportation to and from Denver. Transportation costs in Denver, vary, depending on the location of your internship or service-learning assignment.

The Wartburg West program fee is \$250. Financial aid and scholarships apply to Wartburg West expenses in the same manner as a term on campus.

The college-owned Wartburg West apartments are located at 777 E. 14th Avenue in downtown Denver. Classes are held at Saint John's Cathedral; 1350 Washington Street.
