Preferred:

o Demonstrated experience working with non-profit and other organizations in a service-learning/experiential learning context.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Teach the equivalent of seven undergraduate courses across the fall, winter, and four-week May term. Reassigned time from teaching responsibilities may be available depending on the characteristics, interests and other responsibilities of the successful candidate.
- o Direct the Institute for Leadership Education (ILE), including administrative oversight and development of curricula and other programs as well as convening the Leadership Working Group.
- Develop and strengthen on-campus partnerships (e.g., Student Life, First-Year Seminar, Athletics) that integrate the ILE's understanding of leadership in ways that enrich student learning and activities.
- o Advise students in the leadership minor and post-baccalaureate certificate program.
- Supervise administrative staff in the ILE.
- In consultation with President and VPAA, develop liaison relationships with external organizations.
- Carry out meaningful scholarship related to the required qualifications above.
- Provide an annual report summarizing the work and its impact on students, and describe how funding from the Burling Endowment has supported the mission of Wartburg College, enhancing student learning and engagement.
