Preferred:

- PhD in Social Psychology (completed by September 1, 2023)

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

The successful candidate will fulfill the duties of tenure track faculty to include:

1. Primary teaching responsibilities: teach seven courses (3-3-1) in the academic year including *Introduction to Psychology; Research Methods* sequence; *Social Psychology; Theories of Personality; Health Psychology*; courses in the general education curriculum, and in the area of specialization.
2. The successful candidate will also mentor student research projects, advise program majors and minors, and engage in scholarship and service appropriate to the liberal arts setting.
3. Contribute to student recruitment activities
