 - Empower and equip students, faculty, and staff to work together to provide innovative ministries on campus
 - Lead worship services including frequent preaching
 - o Provide Pastoral counseling and work closely with counseling services to holistically serve students in need
- Create and execute a vision for spiritual life that both honors the theological foundations of Wartburg College's mission and identity and embraces the spiritual needs of our current and future generations of students
 - Work collaboratively with the McCoy Family Distinguished Chair in Lutheran Heritage and Mission to uplift mission and identity
 - Find opportunities to infuse the mission pillar of faith into the daily life of the College
 - Align efforts with campus leaders to challenge and nurture students through focused efforts in interfaith activity, vocation, and diversity, equity, and inclusion
 - Reimagine the Spiritual Life & Campus Ministry (SLCM) Team
 - Utilize the Moehlmann Chaplaincy Chair and funds to engage the campus in opportunities for theological education and growth

- Experienced preacher, worship leader, pastoral counselor
- Proven ability to provide collaborative leadership for innovative ministries and team building

- Three years of experience in a Congregation
